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PREFACE.



I OFFER my hearty thanks to my friend Dr. E. G. MONK, Organist and Choirmaster of York Minster ; firstly, for suggesting the present work ; secondly, for selecting the texts, for which grave task he is specially qualified by his musicianly knowledge of the fitness of words for lyrical treatment, and by his professional daily experience during five-and-twenty years of the uses and requirements of the Church.

All the pieces in this series are intended to be sung in chorus ; but, in churches with small choirs, several may, without detriment to their effect, be sung by a quartet of one voice to a part. The choice of stops on the organ is left to the discretion of the player, according to the extent of his instrument. The following marks, however, indicate five gradations of power—*pp*, *p*, *mf*, *f*, *ff*—the first denoting a single eight-foot stop, the last signifying the full power of the organ. Directions for 1st or 2nd Manual are employed where a change of quality, or where one quality for the right hand and another for the left, is desired.
