



P R E F A C E.

THE following Collection of Church Melodies is presented to the Public, with the view of directing the attention of Congregations and Families to the cultivation of Sacred Music.

The object of the Editors has been to combine practical utility with beauty of Melody and accuracy of Harmony; and, by the adaptation to each Tune of an easy accompaniment for the Organ or Piano-Forte, to enable a performer of moderate skill to acquit himself with satisfaction, whether in the Church or the Parlour.

It is believed that the work embraces Airs suited to all the metres in use. Among them will be found some few Psalm and Hymn Tunes which are established in public favour, and which on that account have been deemed worthy of a place in this volume. But by far the greater portion of them have never before been in print; and have either been used exclusively in the worship of Christ Church and St Stephen's, or were composed expressly for this Collection.

The Parts have been arranged as First Treble, Second Treble, Tenor and Bass, in the belief that the Organist will thereby be enabled more easily to supply voices for each of them; but he will not forget that the Part called *Second Treble* will often produce a much better effect, if sung by *alto* voices, should he have them at his command.

To Messrs Loud, Cross, C. Hommann, Ritter, Norris and Emerick, who have so kindly contributed their Compositions to the work, the Editors beg leave to offer their thanks. But they feel themselves called upon especially to express their obligations to Mr Hommann, for the advice and assistance which he has so liberally bestowed. And although they are aware that all they can say would add but little to his widely extended reputation; yet they cannot refrain from acknowledging, thus publicly, the high esteem in which they regard his talents and theoretic knowledge, and his elevated professional feeling.

The Editors have been induced, by high authority, to select the present shape and size of their Volume, (which, it will be observed, is exactly similar to that of an octavo Book of Common Prayer), in the hope that it may form a companion to that revered book, in the pews of all who feel an interest in promoting and participating in the *congregational* worship of the Creator by "Psalms and Hymns."

Should the present undertaking prove acceptable, it is the intention of the Editors, in completion of their project, to publish a Second Volume, which will be devoted to Anthems, Sentences and Chants, the greater portion of which will be original compositions.
