TRANSCRIPTION NOTES

The manuscript is in fairly good conditions and its digitalisation is well done.

The scribe used a black-brownish ink which is very clear and legible. The scribe's handwriting is precise, although there are some inconsistencies and gaps, in regards to the little grace notes (1), the staccato missing from the Viole and BC, and the sequence of piano (usually missing when the singer part starts) and forte (noted).

The scribe did not write the parts for Violini II in full, and used the word *unis.* (bars 1-6, 13-36, 39-48, 70-74).

The original key for Domizio (tenor) is C4.
