Louis, par la grace de Dieu, Roy de France et de Navarre, a nos amés et feaux Conseillers les gens tenant nos Cours de Parlement, Maîtres des requêtes ordinaires de notre Hôtel, Grand Conseil, Prévost de Paris, Baillifs, Senechaux, leurs Lieutenants civils, et autres nos Justiciers qu'il appartient salut. Notre bien aimé, Jaques Hotteterre l'un des Musiciens de notre Chambre pour la Fl.^e Trav.^e nous a fait exposer qu'il desireroit donner au public divers Ouvrages de Musique tant vocale qu'instrumentale, et pour les Flût.^s Travers.^s a 2. ou plusieurs parties de sa composition s'il nous plaisoit de luy accorder nos lettres de privilege pour la ville de Paris seulement. Nous avons permis et permetons par ces presentes audit Jaques Hotteterre le Romain de faire imprimer et graver ledit Ouvrage en telle forme, marge, caractere, conjointem.^t ou separém.^t et autant de fois que bon luy semblera, et de le vendre, faire vendre et debiter part.^t notre Royaume pendant le tems de douze années consecutives a compter du jour de la date des presentes. Faisons deffence a toutes personnes de quelque qualité et condition qu'elles soient d'en introduire d'impression étrangere dans aucun lieu de notre obeissance, et a tous imprimeurs libraires et autres dans ladite ville de Paris seulem.^t d'imprimer, faire imprimer, de graver, ou faire graver, vendre faire vendre ny contrefaire ledit Ouvrage en tout ny en partie, et d'y en faire venir vendre ny debiter d'autre impression que de celle qui aura été gravée ou imprimée pour ledit exposant sous peine de confiscation des exemplair.^s contrefaits, de mil livres d'amende contre chacun des contrevenans, dont un tiers a nous, un tiers a l'hôtel Dieu de Paris, et l'autre tiers aud.^t expos.^t et de tous depens, dommages et interests. A la charge que ces presentes seront enregistrées tout au long sur le registre de la communauté des imprim.^s et Libraires de Paris, et ce dans trois mois de la date d'icelles, que la gravure et impression dudit Ouvrage sera faite dans n^re Royaume et non ailleurs, en bon papier et beaux caracteres conformém.^t aux reglem.^s de la librairie, et qu'avant que de les exposer en vente il en sera mis 2. exemplaires dans notre bibliothèque, un dans celle de notre Château du Louvre, et un dās celle de n^re tres cher et feal Chevalier Chancelier de France le S.^r Phelipeaux Comte de Pontchartrain Command.^t de nos Ordres, le tout a peine de nullité des presentes, Du contenu desquel.^s vous mand.^s et enjoign.^s de faire jouir l'expos.^t ou ses ayant cause plainem.^t et paisiblem.^t sans souffrir qu'il leur soit fait aucuns troubles ou empéchem.^s Voulons que la Copie des print.^s qui sera imprimée ou gravée au comencem.^t ou a la fin dudit ouvrage soit tenue pour diem.^t signifiée, et qu'aux copies collationnées par l'un de nos amés et feaux Conseillers et Secretaires soy soit adjou^tée cōe a l'original.
