The lute tablature has been adapted by the editor to the new key, adhering as closely as possible to the content of the original.

It should be noted that the title page of Morley's book describes its contents as "Ayres or Little Short Songs, to Sing and Play to the Lute, with the Base Viole". This suggests that Morley intended both instruments to be used, and did not (unlike some of his contemporaries) regard the bass viol as an alternative to the lute.

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
