## **Notes for Ricercata 4**

(page 29 of manuscript)

Although the manuscript of Ricercata 4 is in a poor state, with many areas darkened by ink having seeped through the medium, it was possible to reconstruct the piece accurately.

- *Title*: Virgiliano indicates that the piece is intended for "Cornetto, Violino, Traversa et altri instrumenti". He does not mention specifically, as he does in other pieces, the "Flauto", i.e. the recorder. Indeed, the range of the piece is not well adapted to the recorder, particularly because it would predominate in the high register of the instrument.

- *Proposed arrangement*:

The proposed transcription for recorder in F (Treble) is therefore an arrangement. It was derived from the original by transposing up by an octave. The passages extending below F4 were then modified to fit the range of the instrument. Twelve short passages were thus modified, in the following bars: No. 42, 65-66, 120-123, 142, 157-158, 169, 190-191, 238-239, 299-300, 315-316, 318-319 and 339. Altogether 22 out of the total 342 bars were modified.

- *Alterations*:

Cadenza-type alterations should be considered in a number of places, e.g. bars 146, 283, 286, 289, 290 and 295.

Some players may wish to add more alterations.

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
