NOTE.—Dryden's 'King Arthur' was written in 1685 and produced in 1691. Purcell's music is not concerned with the play itself, but is confined to interpolated scenes which the audience of the day demanded. This number was probably a well-known song of the day which Purcell adopted. Only the solo line and an instrumental bass are found, the latter differing in various MSS, and, in some of these, bars are ruled for chorus but not filled in. There are no marks of expression in the original. A fresh text has been added. Other numbers from 'King Arthur' for equal voices will be found in the Oxford Choral Songs, Nos. 319, 370, 371, 374, and 1,591.
