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Das Solobuch für Flöte enthält, sorgfältig durchgesehen, teils Neuausgaben vergriffener, namentlich für das Studium wertvoller Werke (Kuhlau, Fürstenau, Heinemeyer), teils zwar noch vorhandene, aber mit neuen, eingehenderen Vortragszeichen versehene Stücke. In der Hugenotten-Fantasie dürfte der von Heinemeyer hinzugefügte, bislang noch nicht veröffentlichte Schluß besonders interessieren.

Der Herausgeber verfolgt das Ziel, solche Spieler, denen eine umfassende musikalische Ausbildung fehlt, durch eingehende Vortragsbezeichnung anzuleiten, den geistigen Inhalt eines Musikstückes gründlich zu erfassen und wirkungsvoll wiederzugeben.

Andantino.
