Lady Mary or Preabrasinski



First Lady falls in between the 2^d & 3^d Gent; and at the same time the 1st Gent falls in between the 2^d & 3^d Ladies foot it out on opposite sides meet again & foot it lead down the middle up again & poussette

The New May Moon



Change sides back again down the middle up again and right and left



First Lady set to the 2^d Gent: & change places the 1st Gent: set to the 2^d Lady & change places swing poussette & right & left

The Batteuse Country Dance



The 1st Couple allemand half round with the right hand, the 1st Gent: turn the 2^d Lady half round with left hand & back again with the right, at the same time the 1st Lady repeats the same figure with the 2^d Gent the 1st couple half allemand with the left hand to their own places lead down the middle up again & poussette with the top couple

Prince Blucher's favorite Dance



Set and hands across the same back again lead down the middle up again and right and left

The Batteuse



This Dance is performed by 4 Ladies & 4 Gentlemen placing themselves in the form of a Cotillion, the 1st & 3^d Couples meet in the middle & go back to their own places 3 Beats of the hands & Allemand with their partners, the 2^d & 4th Couples repeat the same figure, the 1st Lady figures with the Gent: on her right 3 Beats of the hands & Allemand the same with the other Gentlemen, the other 3 Ladies repeat the same figure, the 4 Gentlemen do the same figure with the 4 Ladies, the 1st Lady goes all round to her place finishing facing her partner, the other 3 Ladies do the same forming a cross, the 4 Gentlemen repeat the same figure and take their partners by the Arm — all 8 Promenade to their places, the Ladies keep the cross, all 8 right & left all round to their places.
